Anchorage, Alaska

Today's travels will take us south to the city of Seward, gateway to the **Kenai Fjords National Park**. Here we will board a special boat for a tour along Resurrection Bay viewing several species of birds, including puffins and eagles.

We'll also watch for sea lions, otters, and even orca and humpback whales. We'll return to Anchorage this evening and prepare for our flight home. (B, L)

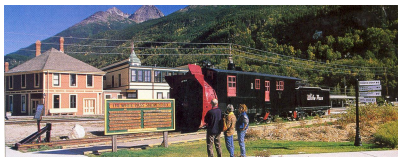

Monday, July 16 **Juneau, Alaska**
We begin our Alaska adventure this morning by boarding our flight to the great state of Alaska. Upon arrival to Juneau, Alaska's capital city, a motorcoach will be awaiting our arrival. We will then enjoy a tour of the city of Juneau including their biggest attraction, **Mendenhall Glacier**. We will make a brief stop at the **University of Alaska grounds** for a spectacular view overlooking Mendenhall Glacier. The rest of the day will be at your leisure.

Tuesday, July 17 **Skagway, Alaska**
Early this morning, we will begin our cruise on the **Inside Passage** to Skagway on board the Alaska ferry. This narrow passage will define the route that early settlers traveled passing glaciers and icebergs enroute to Skagway. A narrator from the Department of Natural Resources will be describing our passage. Skagway is a town that owes its birth to the 1797 Gold Stampede. Skagway's downtown historical district, false fronted buildings and boardwalks date back to the gold rush! Our overnight accommodations are in Skagway.



Wednesday, July 18 **Whitehorse, Yukon**
This morning, we will board the **White Pass and Yukon Railroad** for an unbelievable breathtaking ride with photo opportunities at every turn. Once back on our coach, a short stop will be made at Carcross and then on into Miles Canyon on the Yukon River. Upon arrival to Whitehorse, we will make a short stop at the S.S. Klondike as well as see the fish ladder, Old Log Church, Log Cabin Skyscrapers, and other interesting sights. After checking into our accommodations for the evening, we will have a rousing good time at the **Frantic Follies**.

Thursday, July 19 **Tok, Alaska**
The entire day will be spent traveling along the Alaska Highway. The highway has been greatly improved in the past several years, originally built in 1949. We will make stops to view the original bridges and see the authentic trappers cabins. We'll drive as far as Tok, the "dog sled capital of the world." Our overnight will be in Tok.

Friday, July 20 **Valdez, Alaska**
We will travel the Richardson Highway to Valdez today. We will make stops at the **Worthington Glacier**, where the blue ice is blemished with glacial debris and crevasses. Continuing on, we will ride through Thompson Pass with its narrow chasms that open up to reveal snowfields and jagged slopes. Richardson Highway then winds through the **Keystone Canyon** passing Bridal Veil and Horse Tail Falls as they plummet to the roadside. We will make several stops for photo opportunities. We continue on the Valdez to our accommodations for the next two evenings. (B)

Saturday, July 21 **Valdez, Alaska**
Today we will enjoy a full day cruise of **Prince William Sound** passing Bligh Reef, where the Exxon Valdez spilled. This is more than just a glacier tour. We'll see and float within thousands of icebergs, many may be larger than the

boat we are in, with seals resting on the bergs. Our lunch is included on this cruise. On our return to Valdez, we'll cruise past the pipeline terminal and our captain will give us the highlights of the terminal. (B, L)

Sunday, July 22 **Fairbanks, Alaska**
We board our coach this morning to head North to Fairbanks. We will make a stop along the way at Delta Junction. We will also make a stop at the North Pole to visit the Santa Claus House. Upon arrival to Fairbanks, we will check into our accommodations for the next two evenings before enjoying an **All-You-Can-Eat Salmon Bake**. (B,D)

Monday, July 23 **Fairbanks, Alaska**
Today begins with a drive out to the **Little El Dorado Gold Camp**. At the camp, we will see demonstrations of the different ways of finding gold as well as panning some for our selves. On our drive back to Fairbanks, we will stop for a great view of the Alaska pipeline. This afternoon, we will board the **Riverboat Discovery** and cruise the Chena and Tanana Rivers. (B)



Tuesday, July 24 **Denali, Alaska**
The ride this morning will be relaxing as we watch the beautiful scenery. We will stop in Nenana, the home port of the tug and barge fleet which carries tons of freight, fuel, and supplies to villages along the Tanana and Yukon Rivers. We will check into our lodging this afternoon, and then we will enjoy a **guided tour of Denali National Park** highlighting the history of the Park. This evening, we will enjoy **Cabin Nite**, a Gold Rush tale of adventure in early 1900's Alaska including an **all-you-can-eat dinner**. (B,D)
